nawha County, West Virginia; died January 11, 1898, at Summitville, Madison County, Indiana. On April 15, 1841, he was married to HARRIET SAYRE, in Meigs County, Ohio. She was born June 24, 1822, at Pomeroy, Meigs County, Ohio; died January 13, 1918; buried in the Forestville Cemetery, Madison County Indiana. She was the daughter of John Sayre and Hannah Jones. This John Sayre was the son of Daniel Sayre and Sarah Hall; Daniel Sayre was born September 17, 1760; died September 17, 1824 and is buried at Letart Falls, Ohio. Daniel Sayre was the son of David Sayre and Hannah Frazier; David Sayre was born May 30, 1736; died July 11, 1826; buried at Letart Falls, Ohio. During the Revolutionary War, David Sayre was a Private in Richard Townleys Company, from Elizabeth Township, 1st Regiment, Essex County, New Jersey. Further information about the Sayre family may be obtained from Banta's "The Sayre Family".

William Greenlee received a common school education, and for some years was manager of the Kanawha Salt Works, near Charleston, West Virginia. In 1852 he removed to Madison County, Indiana, and purchased a tract of land near Forestville. The county at that time was sparsely settled, the nearest trading post being twenty miles away, and a journey to mill sometimes occupied several days. Being of an ingenious turn of mind, he made the shoes for his own family and also did cobble work for the neighbors during spare hours. Mrs. Greenlee learned spinning and weaving and supplied the family with clothing, blankets, etc. In 1897 he moved to a comfortable home in Summitville to live a retired life. In politics he was a Republican. Although a member of no church, he was a man of sterling worth, upright and honorable and a highly respected and esteemed citizen.
