daughter of Elizabeth Greenlee Van Bibber and Richard Tillis, was born January 26, 1834, in Mason County, West Virginia. On January 24, 1852, in Mason County, West Virginia, she was married to NATHAN S. SMITH who was born in 1831, in Mason County, West Virginia; he was the son of Isaac E. Smith and Rachael McGuire. Nathan's grandparents were Samuel Smith, a native of Rockbridge County, Virginia, and Jane Edwards of New York. They were married about 1804 and settled in Mason County, West Virginia. Samuel Smith's father, the great grandfather of Nathan, was James Smith who came from England with the British Army during the Revolutionary war, was wounded and taken prisoner at the battle of Bunker Hill. After the war he elected to stay in this country and settled in Virginia; he died in Rockbridge County, Virginia. Nathan Smith appears to have gone to Iowa, and lived in that state and Kansas, Arkansas and Missouri. This writer has been unable to contact any member of the family except the family of Sarah Margaret. Nathan Smith was a farmer, carpenter and harness maker; he had a shop at Uniontown, Kansas.
