acres of wheat, but my mother, who was a little, nervous person was afraid of the Indians. After the Indians went on the war path, we were warned by the friendly ones to leave before we were burned out; so we packed a few belongings by quickly throwing them into sheets and tying the ends together and tying them on the saddles. The river was up and we had to swim the horses across the swift waters to reach safety at my grandfather's farm. I do not remember just how soon after this we left Oklahoma but I believe it was in 1906; dad fixed up a covered wagon with beds, stove, table, etc. but it was not as bad as it sounds, in fact I remember this as one of the best times of my life. I don't know why it should have taken so long but it seems we were on the road for months before we settled near Galena, Missouri, where we lived for about four years. Our next move was to Wichita, Kansas, where we made our permanent home. Dad was in the oil and mining business there."
